

### Stoneville Reports New Natural Stone Launch in the UK

As part of its commitment to introduce new types of marble and other natural stones, Stoneville is launching Azul Jade is a new stone that is being currently marketed in the UK.

As the name implies, it is one of the very few blue natural stones. Unlike other types of blue natural stones (Azul Bahia and Azul Macaubas), Azul Jade has light background with blue, violet and to a lesser extent green overtones.

Due to the fact that the quarry is quite new with a relatively large capacity, Stoneville can supply it at prices lower than market prices of either Bahia or Macaubas both of which cost hundreds of Euros per sq m.

Stoneville reports that Azul Jade can be specified for large scale commercial projects without running a risk of failing to obtain required quantities or grades.

Whilst being suitable for use in various interiors, especially for wall panelling in halls, lobbies and sitting areas, as well as table tops and countertops, this natural stone can be also a unique solution for areas around swimming pools, bathrooms, as well as for yachts and ships.

Thanks to the floating pattern and colour pallet, large panels can also be used on their own, especially when framed, as marble artwork for wall decoration. Azul Jade is quite unique in this respect. Such wall decoration with (large) panels of natural stones is getting quite popular in high-end interior design across Europe and Middle East. To date, mostly onyx panels have been used due to their natural patterns. Onyx, however, is largely limited to white, yellow, violet and green colours. Azul Jade is a blue alternative, enhanced by rich natural patterns.

Azul Jade comes in large slabs and tiles of various sizes (most applicable being 600mmx600mm). And, it comes in two grades.
